A MESSAGE FROM OUR OUTGOING EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Since its launch in 2017, League of Innovators has hyper focused on the abilities of youth and their unlimited potential for innovation, connection to emerging new markets, and creation of unique solutions to the world's most pressing challenges. Throughout the past 4 years we have achieved so much as an organization, building a funnel of five programs to meet the needs of youth all across the country. From our online learning platform Innovators Academy, to our annual digital summer camp and Innovation Challenge, to our Foundations Incubator, Labs Accelerator, and our Boost Residency, our focus remained the same - create rich applied learning and support environments that were built on the foundations of an entrepreneurial mindset, providing youth the tools to create the world that they want to live in.

Rallying a community of support from across the startup, investment, innovation and knowledge ecosystems to raise our next generation, we have been able to support 656 youth entrepreneurs, 360 youth led startups who have created just over \$870M+ of enterprise value. Our youth entrepreneurs are representative of the diversity of our next generation across the country with 55% being founders who are Black, Indigenous or People of Colour, 48% are women founders, and 10% LGBTQIA2S+ founders. We believe we have much work yet to do but we believe building a next generation that is empowered, connected, and awakened to the future needs of our world are some of the critical pillars of our future work.

I am so excited for the next chapter of League of Innovators and the amplified impact it will have and am honoured to hand the reigns over to Melissa Allen to steward the organization into the next chapter!

Remember an investment into the next generation is always an invaluable one.





Our Impact






The LOI Difference

What we believe the difference is - the entrepreneurial mindset.

A mindset that is composed of a series of competencies, all aligned with competencies for the future. This is why in 2021 we had the privilege of working with RBC to develop our entrepreneurial mindset core competencies framework to enable us to evaluate and report on the competency acquisition for youth that participate in our Innovators Academy and early acceleration programs such as Foundations and Labs.




Our Programs

An investment in youth is an investment into our collective future. Youth face staggering challenges ranging from growing unemployment to the uncertainty of climate change. Those challenges are exacerbated for youth who have historically been excluded.

We exist to provide "out of the box" experiences, education, accessible opportunities and support so youth can thrive into the future with a digital skill set and an entrepreneurial mindset.

We focus on:

- 1. Alternative entrepreneurial curriculum created for youth ages 15-30 to foster the entrepreneurial mindset and purpose.
- 2. Connection to a national network of peers, entrepreneurs, investors, and mentors.
- 3. Free, equitable access to programs and supports regardless of gender, race, ethnicity, location, socioeconomics, or educational background.
- 4. Programming without cliffs to provide an ongoing ecosystem of support on the entrepreneurial journey.

Innovators Academy

The Innovators Academy was launched in May 2020 to help youth and educators build entrepreneurial acumen. Over the last year, we've partnered with events, youth organizations, classrooms and educator conferences across Canada to bring stories and resources to help youth ages 14-25 explore what it means to be an entrepreneur, how to use it as a force for good, and tangible steps they can take to start taking action.

In January 2021, we launched a 6-week email course called 'Discover the Entrepreneur in You' designed to help aspiring entrepreneurs become more self-aware and gain clarity on their why as an entrepreneur, the problem they want to solve and how to activate their inner entrepreneur. As part of the Academy, LOI also hosted two youth entrepreneurship camps in November 2020 in partnership with DECA Ontario and our annual summer camp in July 2021. We also worked closely with Junior Achievement BC to deliver the Pitch Training for 100+ youth from across the province in the Discover Your Pitch Program.

Summer of Impact Entrepreneurship Camp

The Summer of Impact Camp was a 4-week virtual camp for budding impact entrepreneurs across Canada! The camp consisted of 8 live sessions in total with 26 speakers and facilitators and 12 mentors, all focused on sharing their stories of what it means to use entrepreneurship as a force for good. Participants went through the process of finding their personal why, identifying and understanding problems they want to solve, building and validating solutions and beginning to share their ideas with others around them.

Impact Innovation Challenge

LOI's annual Impact Innovation Challenge is designed to help young changemakers validate their unique ideas, gain access to a national network of resources and mentors, and give them the confidence to work on tangible solutions to personal, economic and social issues. This year, the Impact Innovation Challenge consisted of 3 categories for Aspiring Entrepreneurs, Growth Entrepreneurs and Non-Profit Entrepreneurs. Thanks to SAP, we offered a \$5000 cash prize for each category along with coaching and resources from Hootsuite, Osler, Accelerate Okanagan, Scale Collaborative and Volition.

Devinder submitted an idea called Cequest to the Impact Innovation Challenge with the goal of validating and finding support to build a prototype that captures and sequesters CO2 from both the air and ocean. Devinder won first place in the Aspiring Entrepreneur category and was invited to join the LOI Labs Accelerator where he is actively working on validating and building his venture and getting ready to launch his prototype.

Our acceleration programs support entrepreneurial youth on their journey to build great businesses of tomorrow - today. Through our programs and community, we welcome every youth founder in Canada who either gets introduced to us, reaches out to us, or applies for one of our programs and strive to provide them curated and impactful support. We have taken the time and effort to build out our three core programs to ensure we meet the needs of youth entrepreneurs across Canada. Therefore, we are constantly working to continue to better understand the needs and challenges faced by youth entrepreneurs today so that we can better grow and adapt our programming to help founders overcome these challenges and be successful in their ventures. Our programs focus on: 1. Idea Incubation (Foundations) 2. Growth (Labs) and 3. Scale (Boost).

In 2021, this work culminated in initiatives such as our Black Youth Entrepreneurship Growth Program stream in Labs, our Social Impact stream in Labs, the launch of our Boost program, and the launch of LOI Venture. We look forward to continuing this momentum in 2022 and beyond as we further contribute to the development of a thriving entrepreneurial ecosystem in Canada, one that is accessible to all of Canada's youth innovators and changemakers.

Foundations Idea Incubator

Foundations Idea Incubator is an immersive 6-week idea incubation program delivered online for any young person wanting to test their impact idea, startup or nonprofit. The program includes online course work, live webinars, accountability groups, and group coaching calls.

- Coaching and support
- Storytelling and mentorship from entrepreneurs a few steps ahead

She is a proud advocate for neurodiversity as a competitive advantage in the Canadian workplace environment and, as a Synapcity board member, she works tirelessly to build bridges and accelerate quality civic engagement and civic participation opportunities for youth in Ottawa's local democracy.

Labs Accelerator

Labs accelerator is a 12-week accelerator focused on supporting youth entrepreneurs ready to launch and grow their startups. The program includes online learning, live workshops with subject matter experts over the 12 themes of business, AMAs with leading entrepreneurs and investors, accountability groups, mentors and one on one coaching.

"I've loved having access to all of the resources, network connections, and learning sessions in the LOI Labs program. We have valued the opportunities for leadership development, strategic growth, and understanding important aspects of pitching and fundraising as we build up the foundations of our business. One of the biggest gifts has been the community our incredibly supportive cohort of founders who both encourage and inspire us to reach farther than we could alone."

Our company started with my journey as a sixteen year-old homeless youth, living in the streets of Peterborough. Those days involved waking up to how my life wasn't working and doing my best to try and change it. But, being on my own and without any support, it didn't feel possible. However, people saw me putting in the work and went out of their way to support me. A family took me in, teachers bought me shoes, and respected individuals began to mentor me. Somewhere along the way, a friend pointed out that scholarships were basically "free money" and that I could use that money to attend university and change the future that was ahead of me. It was because of that early support that I became the first in my family to graduate university and a Top 20 Under 20 award recipient. Making a difference in the lives of students matters to me. Those early experiences with clients encouraged me to become a mentor to youth and to do what I can in my life to be of support to others. This is the premise around which Student Support was formed. Our mission is to make the term "struggling student" a concept only studied in history books. "

Black Youth Entrepreneurship Growth Program

The Black Youth Entrepreneurship Growth Program is designed to provide Black youth entrepreneurs a curated stream of resources and tools built specifically for Black youth entrepreneurs in partnership with Black Entrepreneurs and Businesses of Canada Society (BEBC) in addition to the entire suite of Labs Accelerator Program benefits.

"Black Entrepreneurs society of Canada underwent an extensive research and evaluation process of different youth programs to find a suitable partner for our inaugural Black Youth Entrepreneurs program launch. After that process, we discovered that the League of Innovators (LOI) best fit the program's vision we hope to build and the flexibility to allow for us to add some of our Black cohort-specific programmings.

Social Impact Stream

The Social Impact and Innovation Program was added in response to the growing number of founders in our Labs program who have social impact at the core of their ventures. In partnership with leading Canadian organizations and individuals in the social impact space, 6 additional workshops were added to the Labs programs. Topics covered included human-centered design, systems thinking and leadership, impact measurement, blended funding models, impact investing, and the future of social innovation.

Boost Residency

Boost Residency is a 12-month support accelerator for high growth youth-led startups across Canada by founders under the age of 30. The program provides support to these leading entrepreneurs with Scaling, Operations, HR, and Investment Readiness and providing a peer-led space to learn and grow together. In 2021, we ran our first cohort of Boost with 14 incredible youth-led start-ups.



Financial Highlights



Laggue of Innovators Audited Einancial Statements propared by Dowardhuck CDA Inc


Fiscal Calendar runs September 2020 to August 2021.
